Members of the chapter's Awards Committee and Board of Directors have the discretion to honor as few or as many nominees as they choose.

ENTRY FEE: None

PERIOD COVERED: Calendar year of 2011

PREPARATION OF NOMINATION: Each nomination must include the following:

- 1) Cover letter from the editor or news director of the sponsoring organization;
- 2) Completed entry form copied from this pamphlet;
- 3) Completed nomination form downloaded from the chapter's website: www.phoenixspj.org; and
- 4) All associated material, where applicable. See below.

Print

Original tear sheets are preferred, mounted on 8-inch by 11.5-inch paper.

TV

DVD of the entry should accompany cover letter and entry form.

Radio

CD of the entry should accompany cover letter and entry form.

Online

Links to currently posted material should be noted if applicable. Prints of content or printed screenshots of older articles/posts also are accepted.

SUNSHINE AWARDS


Honoring Arizonans – both journalists and non-journalists – whose actions helped foster greater openness in government in 2011 through improved access to public records or open meetings.

Division 1:

Journalists actively employed in the print, broadcast or online industry in Arizona during 2011.

Division 2:

Non-journalists, including but not limited to educators, elected officials, activists, and more, either residing in Arizona or working on behalf of FOI issues in Arizona during 2011.



THE PHIL ALVIDREZ AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN JOURNALISM

Honoring an Arizona journalist from any medium who has demonstrated a continuous commitment over time to high standards of ethical professional conduct and a spirited defense of the First Amendment or Freedom of Information issues. Named for the former KTVK-TV news director and FOI crusader.

THE LLOYD CLARK "HOW IT MADE PRINT" AWARD

Honoring print journalists (all circulations) responsible for a published story, photograph, or graphic design whose own story of how it became reality is exceptional. Unusually difficult circumstances, or unusual tenacity in pursing the story will be the hallmark of the subject of the winning entry. Entries need not have been published in 2011. Self-nominated entries encouraged. Includes a cash award. Named for one of the founders of the Phoenix SPJ Chapter.

THE ORDER OF THE SILVER KEY

Honoring journalists from any medium with at least 25 years of experience in the state of Arizona (consecutive or cumulative) whose careers exemplify high standards and consistent, top-quality journalism.
